<b>Description</b>	Rat Primary Placental Microvascular Endothelial Cells are isolated from rat placental microvasculature and exhibit typical cobblestone morphology with expression of endothelial-specific markers. These cells provide a physiologically relevant in vitro model for investigating placental vascular development, angiogenesis, barrier function, and mechanisms underlying maternal-fetal exchange and placental disorders. Cryopreserved and quality-tested, they are suitable for a wide range of reproductive and vascular biology research applications.

<b>Growth Conditions</b>	<b>PriCoat™ T25 Flasks (<a href="#">G299</a>) coated with Gelatin Coating Solution (0.1%) (<a href="#">TM063</a>) are required for optimal cell adhesion and growth.</b> Endothelial Cell Medium Kit, Low Serum ( <a href="#">TM155</a> ) + 1% Penicillin/Streptomycin Solution ( <a href="#">G255</a> ), 37.0°C, 5% CO <sub>2</sub> .
<b>Unpacking and Storage</b>	1. Visually examine the packaging containers for signs of leakage or breakage.

<b>Instructions</b>	<p>2. Immediately transfer frozen cells from dry ice packaging to a temperature below <math>-130^{\circ}\text{C}</math>, preferably in liquid nitrogen vapor phase storage, until ready for use.</p> <p>To ensure the highest level of viability, thaw the vial and initiate culture as soon as possible upon receipt. If continued storage is desired, the vial should only be stored below <math>-130^{\circ}\text{C}</math> or in liquid nitrogen vapor phase. Do not store at <math>-70^{\circ}\text{C}</math>, as it will result in loss of viability.</p>
<b>Thawing Protocol</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Thaw cells quickly in a <math>37^{\circ}\text{C}</math> water bath while agitating gently (maximum 2 minutes). The vial cap should be kept above the water level to minimize the risk of contamination.</li> <li>2. Decontaminate the vial by spraying and wiping the exterior of the vial with 70% ethanol. From this point onwards, all operations should be strictly carried out inside a biological safety cabinet using aseptic conditions.</li> <li>3. Transfer the cell suspension into a 15ml sterile conical tube containing 8–10ml of pre-warmed, complete growth media. Centrifuge cells at 120xg for 5 minutes.</li> <li>4. Aspirate the supernatant without disturbing the cell pellet. Re-suspend the cell pellet in 6ml of the recommended pre-warmed, complete growth media and dispense into a T25 culture flask.</li> <li>5. Incubate the cells at the recommended conditions.</li> <li>6. Change media the following day to remove non-adherent cells and replenish nutrients.</li> <li>7. Change media every 24–48 hours, and check cells daily under microscope to verify appropriate cell morphology. Change media every day when cells are <math>&gt;70\%</math> confluent. Pre-wash cells with 1X DPBS, No Ca, No Mg (CH110) 1–2 times whenever replacing media.</li> </ol>
<b>Subculture Protocol</b>	<p>Volumes given below are for a T25 flask; proportionally increase or decrease the volume as required per culture vessel size. Subculture cells once the culture vessel is 80% confluent.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Aspirate the culture media, and wash the adherent layer 1–2 times using 5ml sterile pipette with sterile 1X DPBS, No Ca, No Mg (CH110) to dislodge loosely attached cells and remove fraction. Remove and discard the wash solution from flask.</li> <li>2. Incubate cells with add 2ml of pre-warmed 0.05% Trypsin-EDTA for 3–5 minutes. As soon as cells detach (may require few firm gentle taps) add 8–10ml of complete culture media supplemented with 10% FBS to neutralize the trypsin.</li> <li>3. Plate cells in gelatin precoated flasks and incubate the cells at the recommended conditions.</li> <li>4. Change culture media the following day to remove non-adherent cells and replenish nutrients.</li> <li>5. Change media every 24–48 hours, and check cells daily under microscope to verify appropriate cell morphology. Change media every day when cells are <math>&gt;70\%</math> confluent. Pre-wash cells with 1X DPBS, No Ca, No Mg (CH110) 1–2 times whenever replacing media.</li> </ol>
